Church leaders Reverend Theresa Jones and Andrew Simpkins will lead the singing, and of course everyone will be welcome – the more, the merrier. On Sunday 16th December, there'll be a Christmas family disco in the Village Hall, in support of the Acorns Children's Hospice. Solihull buses - not stopping



More tidings of good cheer - the threatened changes to the local bus services have been overturned, and buses will continue to operate between Dickens Heath and Solihull in the new year. Some small changes to the route are envisaged, and both services are expected to terminate in Solihull rather than going through to Dorridge, but the S3 and S3W routes will continue to provide a half-hourly service to Dickens Heath. The U-turn by Transport for West Midlands

follows tireless campaigning by Parish Councillor Trevor Eames [and Worcestershire County Council's decision to subsidise the S3W might also have helped a little – Ed.]

Solihull Council's decision on the closure of Braggs Farm Lane to through traffic is keenly awaited. As you might be aware, the Council have plans to "gate" the road just to the West of the farm, with only farm and emergency vehicles permitted to pass. They contend that the road is not suitable for the increasing traffic which is causing damage to both vehicles and the road. Consultation on the plan ended in early November, and the Parish Council objected, arguing that improving the road instead of closing it would be a much better idea.

Finally, a reminder that the next Parish Council meeting will be on Tuesday 8th January, starting at 19:15.
