Parish Council Meetings

The Parish Council's next meetings will be held on Tuesday September 10th and then Tuesday October 8th 2019, starting at 7.15pm, in our new venue of Dickens Heath Library 1st floor. Please come and join us, with an opportunity to ask questions at the start of the meeting.

Update on Village Green and Playground

We are very pleased that negotiations with Solihull MBC and the Liquidator owners of the Village Green are progressing well. Solihull MBC propose to take back ownership of the Village Green and then lease it back to the Parish Council for 125 years. As of writing, a report is due to go to SMBC Cabinet on July 10th 2019 and, if approved, the process for SMBC to take ownership of the land will begin a week later. By law, SMBC are required to advertise any disposal of land, and the lease of the Village Green to the Parish Council is no exception. So don't be alarmed if you see these adverts – the Village Green is not up for sale, and is still protected by covenant as a public open space. SMBC will then have to consider any responses to the adverts before progressing with their proposal to lease the Village Green to the Parish Council. So, we await the decision of SMBC – but all looks very promising.

Update on Waterside Nature Reserve

This Nature Reserve, also known as the Country Park, is currently owned by the Liquidators. The Parish Council hope that Solihull MBC will take ownership of this land too, and manage it alongside their nearby Large Nature Reserve. Negotiations on this are taking a little longer as SMBC are looking into maintenance costs.

The Parish Council would like to thank members of the Festival on the Green committee for all of their hard work in organising a very successful event, despite the unpredictable weather.
